## The back seat is the safest place to ride.

It is recommended all passengers 12 years of age or under ride in the back seat.



- » Air bags are designed for adults. They deploy at 200 mph in 1/20 of a second causing severe head and neck injuries to children and young adults.
- » When adults wear seat belts, kids wear seat belts. Be a good example and buckle up for every ride. Lap and shoulder belts provide the best protection for preteens and adults.

**Teach your kids to buckle up every ride, every car, every time, forever.** Start this rule when your kids are young.

**Be a good example when you drive.** Your kids are watching and learning even when they are still in their car seats.

Spend time in the car with your new teen driver.

Discuss safety issues, including putting phones away when driving, observing speed limits and following rules of the road.

Encourage your teens to speak up when any driver, including you, is driving unsafely. Teach them to find a safe way home if the driver has been drinking.
